

TAGGED'

On Monday August 11th, period 1 and 2, a Youth Resource Officer came to the school to present 'Tagged' and speak about cyber safety to all year 8's. Tagged encourages young people to reflect on the real life consequences caused by cyber bulling, sexting and a negative digital reputation. The themes of personal and peer safety and responsibility are crucial to maintaining positive online behaviour and digital reputation into adulthood.

What parents can do:

- Be aware of what your teenager is doing on line and explore it with them. Try to locate the computer in a shared or visible place in the home.
- Discuss the kinds of sites that are okay to explore and those that are not, and have clear rules about online activities. If your child is using social networking sites ensures that they understand the privacy features-in particular how to set their profile to private and limit access to their information.
- Encourage them to screen on line "friends" and block anyone who sends offensive content.
- Keep the lines of communication open so your child will be comfortable to talk to you if something is worrying them.

Much planning and preparation is going into the city experience week to be held in week 9. This is a highlight of the year for year 9 students and parents will be kept informed of the arrangements for this.


Awards

Being prepared for classes

Attendance

Students must have a minimum of 90% attendance in all classes at each year level.

Uniform

Full uniform must be worn to and from school, at school and on all school excursions, including interschool sports.

Please note:

- PE / Sports shoes must be lace up runners with non-marking soles
- Facial piercings are not to be worn at school
- Make-up is to be kept to a minimum.

Punctuality

Is expected at the start of each day & for all classes. Any student who is late more than 4 times will have a Friday detention from 3.20pm to 5.20pm.
