



Select Entry Accelerated Learning (SEAL) Program and Scholarship Program

Frequently Asked Questions

1. When do applications for 2021 entry close?

Applications for 2021 entry close on Friday 29 May 2020.

The Edutest date, time and location is still to be determined.

You must register for the SEAL Program and Edutest online using the 'SEAL and Scholarship Program' link on our website homepage. If you require support with the application process, please contact the College by 29 May 2020.

2. How much does it cost to apply for the SEAL Program?

The cost of application is \$85.00.

3. What happens if I don't have a credit or debit card available to make the Edutest payment?

You can purchase a temporary, prepaid Mastercard 'credit' card from Australia Post Offices. You purchase the card, load the money onto it, and make your payment. See for more details: <https://auspost.com.au/money-insurance/buy-gift-cards/auspost-gift-card>

4. Can students apply for more than one type of scholarship?

Yes, you can apply for more than one type of scholarship at one time, whether that is Academic (automatically entered for consideration upon application for the SEAL Program), Sport, Leadership, Citizenship or the Visual and Performing Arts Scholarship.

Please ensure that if you are applying for more than one scholarship, you have suitable evidence and supporting documentation for each scholarship.

5. Which details will I need to complete the application form?

- Name and contact details, such as email, phone number and home address
- Child's name and school name
- Child's teacher's name and email address

Your child will also need complete a paragraph about why they should have a place in the SEAL Program. Please ensure that this paragraph is completed by your child.

You will also be required to submit supporting documentation for your application, which can be scanned and attached during your application process – please see the next question.

6. What documentation do I need to submit with a SEAL Application?

You can scan and attach (upload) all required documentation when submitting your application. You may save your application and return to it if you need to obtain and attach documents before submitting your application.

If you are unable to scan and upload documentation, you must indicate that you will be submitting physical copies of these when asked during the application process. If you are submitting paper copies, you must submit these by the day of the Edutest (Saturday 9 May 2020). No late documents will be accepted.

The following documents are required:

- Your child's latest school reports (Semester 2, Year 5).
- Your child's Year 5 NAPLAN results.
- A piece of extended handwritten **English** work completed by your child. Examples include short essays, narrative writing (stories), and persuasive writing, etc.

Student Reference Forms are sent directly to teachers for completion. Please ensure that you enter the correct email address for your child's teacher.

Please call the College if you require any assistance.

7. When and where do I submit my documentation if I am not sitting the Edutest at St Albans?

If you are not sitting the Edutest at our school because you have sat it elsewhere, you must ensure that you still apply online by **29 May 2020**. All documentation must still be submitted online.

No documentation will be accepted past this date as we have strict timelines to meet.

Note: You may need to attend an interview as part of your SEAL application. If this is to occur, you will be contacted to arrange a suitable date and time.

8. How do I apply for the Academic Excellence Scholarship?

Students who wish to apply for the Academic Excellence Scholarship must apply for the SEAL Program. Applying for the SEAL Program automatically places you under consideration for the Academic Excellence Scholarship. Recipients of the Academic Excellence Scholarship will be placed in the SEAL Program.

Please note that not all students accepted to the SEAL Program will receive an Academic Excellence Scholarship. Academic Excellence Scholarships are granted at the discretion of the school.

9. Can students take the Edutest at another school and share their results with your school?

Yes, you can take the test at another school. Edutest will then normally send us your child's results when our testing occurs. However, not all schools share results - please check on Edutest's website and contact them if needed.

10. How are Edutest results shared?

Generally, Edutest results are shared online with the other schools after their testing dates - they are given your results with all their other testing results. However, not all schools elect to share Edutest results. Please check the school's special conditions, and contact Edutest if you are unsure of the process.

11. Are there practice SEAL Edutest tests available?

Edutest has some practice tests on their website for a fee, although they do say that these are just practice questions and do not resemble the format of the test, which is longer and more complex. See here: <https://www.edutest.com.au/parents.htm>

12. How many times can the Edutest be taken? Can I sit it at more than one school?

You can only take the Edutest once a year. If applying to more than one school, you should take the test at the school with the earliest closing/examination date. See here: <https://www.edutest.com.au/parents.htm>

13. What should I bring if I am **applying also applying for another category of scholarship?**

If you apply for a Sports, Leadership, Citizenship or Visual and Performing Arts scholarship, you will need to submit an online application. You can indicate all the scholarships that you intend on applying for during the application process.

You should submit as much supporting evidence for your scholarship as possible. Evidence that cannot be submitted online should be brought in person, e.g. an audio or video recording. For example:

Sports:

- Letter(s) of recommendation from coaches, P.E. teachers, etc.
- Certificates of achievement/medals.
- Other evidence e.g. images, newsletters, articles.
- School reports

Leadership:

- Letter(s) of recommendation from teachers/Principals.
- Certificates of achievement/recognition of school leadership.
- Evidence of leadership positions, e.g. newsletters, articles, etc.
- School reports

Citizenship:

- Letter(s) of recommendation from teachers/Principals/leaders e.g. church leader.
- Images of you engaged in relevant activities, e.g. volunteering, participating in and leading youth groups, etc.
- Certificates of achievements/recognition.
- Evidence of participation in relevant activities, e.g. newsletters and articles.
- School reports

Visual and Performing Arts:

- Certificates of achievements/examinations.
- Portfolios of work, e.g. sketches, paintings, images of sculptures, etc.
- Letter of recommendation from your music, art, dance or drama teacher(s).
- Evidence of participation in related activities such as art, dance or music competitions, school or community plays, participation in choirs, bands or orchestras, etc. Evidence could include: images, videos, newsletters, articles, etc.
- School reports.

If you have any evidence that cannot be sent via upload (online), please indicate this during your application and list the evidence that you will be submitting in person.
