During the week she is a manager and trainer with Gardening Australia.

Teresa Day is the Convenor at Moonee Valley Sustainability (MVS). Now in its fourth year, MVS is a rapidly growing community of individuals, initiative and community groups who focus on Climate action, Sustainable living and community resilience. Through events such as the Electric Vehicle Festival to programs such as the Strips of Nature,

MVS works collectively and collaboratively to enable everyone in Moonee Valley to "Be the Change".

Teresa is also the founder of Glenbervie Stationeers, a local initiative which is beautifying and building the biodiversity value of a Glenbervie Station, with vegetation plantings. She also works as the Learning and Training Manager at Sustainable Gardening Australia, with experience in sustainable design, community development and environmental education.

A home gardener, chicken keeper and forager she is keen to show how sustainable choices and lifestyle changes can be implemented, where-ever she goes.



Guest Speaker on Monday 21st November 2022 - Past District Governor Grant Hocking

Grant has a 36-year career with Ambulance Victoria (AV) and has worked in most operational areas of the organisation including as a MICA Paramedic, Team Manager, Clinical Support Officer, Clinical Manager and is currently the Improvement Lead for the Grampians region of Ambulance Victoria.

Grant has an interest in clinical quality and was awarded the Ambulance Service Medal (ASM) in the 2014 Australia Day recognitions for development of Clinical Quality Improvement processes.

He was also a member of the Victorian Health Services Review Council for 3 years (2010-2013) and the Victorian Stroke Clinical Network (VSCN) (Victorian Dept. of Health)) for 6 years (2012-2017).

With an interest in Stroke management, Grant has changed internal AV procedures and guidelines and directed state-wide improvements in the outcomes of patients with Stroke and many other projects and research. He was awarded the National Stroke Foundation (NSF) Presidents Award in 2018.

In Rotary, Grant has experienced a lot since he joined Woodend Rotary in 2004, including being President in 2007-2008 and again in 2015-16, as well as many other Board roles including chair of Woodend Rotary Community Newspaper Committee (The New Woodend Star) for four successful years (June 2014-June 2018) overseeing the introduction of full colour printing and transition to a new production process and printing services.


At a Rotary District level Grant has served as Community Service Director (2011-2013), Assistant Governor and Executive AG (2013-2015), and AG mentor (2017-18). Other roles include

- · Foundation and Grants cluster advisor,
- Club Vision facilitator and supporting the
- D9800 Learning and Development (RLI and New Member seminars).

Grant was District 9800 Governor in 2019-20 and introduced the popular Morning Tea with the DG and formed new District committees for Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI), Environmental Sustainability and Peace.

Grant led the District during the initial challenging period of COVID 19 implementing significant change practice and supporting clubs and the district to adopt on-line meetings, new projects and fundraising opportunities.

Grant presented at the Rotary Day at the United Nations in 2019 on behalf of an award recipient. Currently Grant is the Regionalisation District Representative and the District 9800Rotary Foundation Chair.


